Notes from SCBA President

Dear Fellow SCBA Members and Friends,

Much has happened in the past three months. First and foremost, I am excited to announce that the long-awaited the 18th International SCBA Symposium will be held at the Tufts University Conference Center in Boston from July 27 to 31, 2022! The following committees have been formed and plans are in progress:

Program Committee (Zhi-Ming Zheng and Lee Zou, co-Chairs)

Finance/Fundraising Committee (Yong Xu and Pan Zheng, co-Chairs)

Award Committee (Keji Zhao, Chair)

Local Host Committee (Hong Chen, Chair)

Website (Zion Han)

We strive to make this conference a celebration of our extraordinary accomplishments, a welcome venue to interact with your fellow members and to share your exciting science, a unique platform to discuss the ongoing challenges facing our members, and the opportunities to make our society stronger. The SCBA is an inclusive society and welcome you all, whether you are a veteran or new to SCBA, whether you are a PI or a trainee, whether you are from industry or academia. So please mark your calendar and make plan to attend this exciting conference, meet with your friends and colleagues, and have lots of fun.

Secondly, in response to a letter co-signed by the SCBA requesting a congressional hearing on racial profiling of Chinese American Scientists, a congressional roundtable entitled "Researching while Chinese American: Ethnic Profiling, Chinese American Scientists and a New American Brain Drain" was held on June 30th. The roundtable was led by Representatives Jamie Raskin and Judy Chiu, and live streamed to ~1,500 people. As of July 2, it has generated over 11,000 views on YouTube. Thirdly, in light of the increase in hatred and violence toward Asians, Asian Americans and those of Asian identity surrounding the Covid-19 pandemic, the Texas Medical Center held a Stop Asian Hate Rally on May 21, 2021. The event was spearheaded by Dr. Shixia Huang, a life-time member of the SCBA, and attracted

500-600 people. I made a remark on behalf of the SCBA at the Rally stating our belief in equality and inclusion and our rejection of all actions of racism and violence toward AAPI and other ethnic groups.

Last but not least, our society journal Cell & Biosciences just received an Impact Factor of 7.133 for year 2020! It was a remarkably achievement considering that it was only established in 2011. It is the result of the tireless effort by Yun-Bo Shi and Chris Lau, our founding and current Editor-in-Chiefs. Please join me in thanking them for their dedicated service and please also do your part to contribute to the journal by submitting your papers and serving as reviewers.

Now that the summer is upon us and the pandemic appears to be well under control, I hope you have made plans to gather with family and friends and enjoy some well-earned vacations.

The Award Committee chaired by Dr. Keji Zhao is considering candidates for several prestigious SCBA awards. The Fundraising Committee led by Drs. Yong Xu and Pan Zheng is actively working to secure the financial support for this event. Dr. Zion Han, the SCBA webmaster, is working tirelessly to keep the website updated. Finally, the Local Host Committee led by Dr. Hong Chen, President of the SCBA Boston

Chapter, has helped tremendously with the selection of meeting venue and hotels.

Part 1: Membership Profile:

Please visit the SCBA website to update your membership profile information: https://www.scbasociety.org/, as an accurate information listed in your profile will ensure you to receive the full benefits of being an SCBA member.

The following are the most important information of the membership profile that each member should verify and update on time:

1. Email address

Your email address is the most important entry of your membership profile. It ensures you to receive the SCBA Newsletter & important announcements. It is also used for registration to all SCBA events including the International Symposium, as well as to vote or participate SCBA leadership election. Your email address is the only entry that you can't update by yourself, since it is used as your unique name for login to the SCBA website and to update all other information (including your name) in your membership profile. If you need to update your email, please use the "Contact" button on the SCBA website home page to contact the Webmaster to update your email. When login for the first time with your email, click the "Forgot Password" to set your password. If you don't receive an email from SCBA, that means your email address needs to be updated.

Your name, address and organization are important for searching in our membership directory. It will also help the local chapter or divisions to find you for events that might benefit you. They can be easily updated when you login to the SCBA website with your email address and password.

The new SCBA website offers Job Posting. Please contact the webmaster if you have positions to post on the website.



Notes from Editor-in-Chief of Cell & Bioscience

Dear SCBA Members,

Cell & Bioscience was founded by Yun-Bo Shi and the late Kuan Teh Jeang of NIH in 2009 as the society journal for SCBA. It started publications with volume 1 in 2011 and Yun-Bo Shi as the Editor-in-Chief. After ten-year contribution of tireless efforts, Yun-Bo stepped down at the end of 2019. Under his leadership, Cell & Bioscience has achieved tremendous success as an elite multi-discipline journal in the scientific community. It first obtained a journal impact factor of 3.00 in 2012 from the Clarivate Journal Citation Index. The impact of the journal has grown gradually throughout the years, with a significant increase to an impact factor of 5.026 in 2019.

I am delighted to report to you that it has achieved an even higher impact factor of 7.133 from the most recently released Clarivate Journal Citation Reports for 2020, Table 1. The success shows that Cell & Bioscience has become a valuable journal for investigators to report their scientific findings and conceptual reviews in their respective fields.

To sustain such rapid growth, we have implemented a more streamline editorial structure for efficient and effective evaluation of submissions to our journal, as I have reported in March 2021 issue of the SCBA Newsletter. More importantly, your participations of the processes are critical to the eventual success of Cell & Bioscience. There are numerous ways for you to promote the growth of the journal. As established investigators in your respective fields, you can submit **research** and/or **review** articles and comment on current research advances in your fields with **research highlights**, as well as serve on the Editorial Board and assist in evaluations of submissions to the journal. Your participation and submissions will greatly improve the scientific standing on the quality of publications in our journal.

Indeed, many of our SCBA members have stepped up to participate and assist in improving the scientific standing of Cell & Bioscience in organizing special issues on various specific topics. Currently, there are three special issues accepting invited and author-initiated submissions.

1. Emerging Concepts in Neurodegenerative Diseases

- organized by Hui Zheng of Baylor College of Medicine and Lin Mei of Case Western Reserve University.
- Frontiers in Virology and COVID-19 organized by Dong-Yan Jin of the University of Hong Kong, Zhi-Ming Zheng of the National Institutes of Health and Shan-Lu Liu of the Ohio State University.

3. The Human Y Chromosome in Health and Disease



News from the SCBA-Texas Chapter


The 34th Annual Symposium of SCBA-Texas

The SCBA Texas Chapter (SCBA-TX) hosted its 34th annual symposium in a virtual format on Saturday May 15, 2021. This is a long overdue event, which was supposed to occur in the summer 2020 but had to be cancelled because of COVID. Despite being virtual, the symposium was a very successful, completing another new page of the SCBA-TX chapter's long history. There were 86 attendees, representing the faculty members, postdoctoral fellows, graduate students and staff members from all of the academic institutions at the Texas Medical Center, including Baylor College of Medicine (BCM), University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center (MDACC), University of Texas-Health Science Center at Houston (UTHEALTH), University of Houston (UH), Texas A&M-University Institute of Biosciences & Technology (IBT) at Houston, the Methodist Hospital Research Institute (TMHRI) and Rice University. Given its virtual format, there were also participants from other cities of Texas, including University of Texas-Medical Branch at Galveston (UTMB) and Texas A&M University at College Station.



The event's theme was to share scientific research and to train the next generation of researchers. The symposium started in the morning with brief welcome remarks from the SCBA-TX President Dr. Qingchun Tong (UTHEALTH), followed by the Professor Ying-Lai Wang Memorial keynote lecture given by Dr. Alice Ting of Stanford University titled "Optogenetic and chemogenetic technologies for probing molecular and cellular networks". The life-time research achievements of Dr. Wang and the history of the Ying-Lai Wang Memorial Lectureship was addressed by Dr. Xiaodong Cheng, the 2018 President of SCBA-TX. Dr. Ting was introduced by Dr. Meng Wang (BCM). Dr. Ting is an internationally renowned scientist and her research team has made seminal contributions to novel methods using a combination of optogenetic and chemogenetic ways to examine protein interactions and signal pathways. Her research harnesses the power




of directed evolution and synthetic organic chemistry to develop novel methods for studying various cellular processes. Her talk is inspiring to our trainees and faculty members. Of note, Dr. Ting grew up in Texas and has a lot of connections with Texas and it was like home-coming to her.

After enjoying beautiful science from Dr Ting, 34 trainees (students and postdoctoral fellows of Chinese and non-Chinese ethnicity who are currently working in ethnic Chinese faculty laboratories) gave oral presentations in five concurrent breakout room sessions. Dr. Yong Xu (Professor of Baylor College of Medicine) served as the chair of the trainees' sessions. Judges for the trainees' presentations included Drs. Jianhua Yang (BCM), Qin Feng (UH), Wenliang Li (UTHEALTH), Boyi Gan (MDACC), Tianfu Wu (UH), Sherry Gao (Rice), Cynthia Ju (UTHEALTH), Jiang Chang (IBT), Guangwei Du (UTHEALTH), Zheng Sun (BCM), Kai Sun (UTHEALTH), Meng Wang (BCM), Babie Teng (UTHEALTH), Xiaolong Jiang (BCM) and Yi Zhu (BCM).

The winners for the prestigious SCBA-TX trainee awards were: Jing Cai for the first-place award (\$300), Divya Ravirala for the second-place award (\$200), Tao Shen, Yunfeng Ding, Ritu Bohat, Lian He, Wenhao Guo, Hesong Liu, Shannon Erhardt, Lauren Lawless, Xiaolei (Sherry) Zhao, Jessie Morrill, Yong Han, and Longlong Tufor the third-place award (\$100). The winner for the Professor Alexander Yeu-Ming Wang Memorial Scholarship (\$500) is Fatma Yasar. This is a highly prestigious and competitive award that was established in 1995 by Professor Wang's family to honor Professor Alexander Yeu-Ming Wang for his contributions and achievements to science, education, Chinese community, and SCBA in which Dr. Wang served as a founder.

The afternoon session started with the SCBA Keynote Lecture delivered by Dr. Cun-Yu Wang from UCLA. After introduction by Dr. Jinsong Liu from MDACC, Dr. Wang shared his outstanding research on identifying cancer stem cells (CSC) and innovative therapeutic approaches by targeting both CSC key factors and immune checkpoints. His research broadened the knowledge scope of CSC and immunotherapy, especially to a large audience base with interest in cancer research.




As a tradition, the SCBA-TX Treasurer (Dr. Weiyi Peng) presented the financial report during a very brief business session, indicating an impressive increase of our members over the previous year. An election was also held



during the symposium to establish a new leadership team, which includes President Dr. Chonghui Cheng (BCM), President-Elect Dr. Jin Wang (BCM), Secretary Dr. Weiwei Dang (BCM) and Treasurer Dr. Qin Feng (UH). Drs. Feng Yang (BCM, a current membership committee member of national SCBA), Jinsong Liu (MDACC, a current election committee of national SCBA) and Hui Zheng (BCM, the current President of national SCBA) gave a short presentation for National SCBA membership recruitment, biennial SCBA meeting and candidate nominations for the upcoming national SCBA leadership election. On behalf of the leadership team, Dr. Qingchun Tong thanked the attendees and speakers, and also specifically thanked Mrs. Hellen Weng, wife of the late Professor Alexander Yeu-Ming Wang, for her continuous support of the Professor Alexander Yeu-Ming Wang Memorial Scholarship. The newly elected president, Dr. Chonghui Cheng gave concluding remarks with envisions for the new leadership team.

To make the virtual meeting a fun event, the organizing committee has come up a few ways to better engage participants. One is to add 2 raffle drawing sessions to the program. In each session 3 lucky participants were selected by random drawing for a gift card. The other is to add a trivia game as the last meeting session. Dr. Yi Li (BCM, a past SCBA-TX president) led the efforts and he prepared 42 questions, most of them related to national SCBA and SCBA-TX facts and history as well as stories of SCB-TX members. All participants really enjoyed these fun events.

Organizing committee of the 2021 and 34th SCBA-TX symposium includes President Dr. Qingchun Tong (UTHEALTH), Secretary Dr. Jian Hu (MDACC), Treasurer Dr. Weiyi Peng (UH), President-elect Dr. Chonghui Cheng, Dr. Yi Li (BCM) and Dr. Yong Xu (BCM). Due to the nature of virtual event, the meeting was free without any registration fees. This symposium provided a unique opportunity for our trainees and faculty to reconnect amid the COVID epidemic and also concludes the 2020-2021 chapter of SCBA-TX. We wish best of luck to the new 2021 leadership team and look forward to another successful year of SCBA-TX!



Stop Asian Hate Rally at Texas Medical Center

On May 21, 2021, over 500 professors, trainees and staff came together for a "Stop Asian Hate Rally" (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RzxPgspz-Yo) to amplify Asian voices, identity, and culture at the world's largest medical center, Texas Medical Center (TMC).

Dr. Shixia Huang, an associate professor at Baylor College of Medicine and a lifetime member of SCBA organized the event with assistance from Baylor leadership and student organizations as well as many volunteers including Dr. Yong Xu, Treasurer of SCBA.

At her opening remarks, Dr. Huang stated that the rally was an act of resistance to ongoing anti-Asian hate, a show of solidarity to fight injustice and intolerance.

Dr. Hui Zheng spoke on behalf of SCBA. "Members of the SCBA community made breakthrough discoveries and life-saving medicine, including that of Covid-19," said Dr. Zheng. "We owe our growth and success to the opportunity, equity and inclusion the US offered and, in return, we strive to promote equity and inclusion and to create opportunities for others."

Other speakers include Asian community leaders and Baylor leadership. Faculty and student shared their personal experiences of racial discrimination and their fight for justice and equality. 2021 SCBA Election

Call for Nominations of Candidates for the Election of SCBA Officers

In accordance with the SCBA Bylaw, the Nomination Committee is calling for the nominations of candidates for the 2021 SCBA Election of the Chief Operating Officers (COOs) and membership of Council and Nomination and Membership Committees.

Regulation and Submission Process of Nominations

- 1) The nominated candidates must be a lifetime member of SCBA at the time be nominated in order to be eligible to stand for election.
- 2) The candidates can be nominated by a SCBA member or self-nominated.
- 3) The deadline of nomination is extened to August 1, 2021.
- 4) Nomination package includes
 - The Nomination form (see the last page).
 - CV of the nominee
- 5) The nomination should be sent to:
 - Jun Lu, Yale University (jun.lu@yale.edu) the Co-Chair of the Nomination Committee
 - Copy to Lee Zou (lzou1@mgh.harvard.edu), the Secretary of SCBA.

Selection Process

The Nomination Committee will

- 1) review the nominations, and convene a meeting following the nomination deadline
- 2) propose an official ballot and obtain a brief curriculum vita and a description of service to the Society from each of the nominees for each position, based on the eligibility and willingness
- 3) tabulate a list of candidates for the consideration and final approval by the SCBA Council.

The Executive Director shall forward the official ballot to all Active Members on or before September 1, 2021 for a vote by electronic means.

The finalists of the nominated candidates will also be SCBA website: on the http://www.scbasociety.org/.

Voting Process

Available Positions

The positions, and their terms and duties, as described in the SCBA Bylaws, are listed below. The Nomination Committee urges all the SCBA members to nominate the best suitable candidates who represent the interests of the SCBA members and lead the Society moving forward in the future.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICERS (number): term of service

1. **President** (1): January 1, 2024 – December 31, 2025

The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Society and shall preside at all meetings of the Council. Subject to the control of the Council, the President shall have general executive charge, management, and control of the properties, business, and operations of the Society with all such powers as may be reasonably incident to such responsibilities; shall have the authority to agree upon and execute all leases, contracts, evidences of indebtedness, and other obligations in the name of the Society subject to the approval of the Council; and shall have such other powers and duties as may be designated in these Bylaws and as may be assigned to such officer from time to time by the Council. The President shall take a leadership role in the organization and implementation of a Biannual International Symposium during his/her tenure.

2. **Secretary** (1): January 1, 2024 – December 31, 2025

The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Council in books provided for that purpose; shall attend to the giving and serving of all notices; shall organize the Council Meeting and all Council meetings; in furtherance of the Society's purposes and subject to the limitations contained in the Articles of Incorporation, may sign with the President in the name and on behalf of the Society and/or attest the signatures thereto, all contracts, conveyances, franchises, bonds, deeds, assignments, mortgages, notes, and other instruments of the Society; shall have charge of the Society's books; records, documents, and instruments, except the books of account and financial records and securities of which the Treasurer shall have custody and charge, and such other books and papers as the Council may direct, all of which shall be open at reasonable times to the inspection of any Member upon application at the Society's office during business hours and approved by a majority vote of the Council; and shall in general perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary subject to the control of the Council.

3. **Treasurer** (1): January 1, 2024 – December 31, 2025

The Treasurer shall have custody of all of the Society's funds and securities that come into such officer's hands. When necessary or proper, the Treasurer may endorse or cause to be endorsed, in the name and on behalf of the Society, checks, notes, and other obligations for collection and shall deposit or cause to be deposited the same to the credit of the Society in such bank or banks, or financial depositories and in such manner as shall be designated and prescribed by the Council; may sign or cause to be signed all receipts and vouchers for payments made to the Society either alone or jointly with such other officer as may be designated by the Council; whenever required by the Council, shall render or cause to be rendered a statement of the cash account; shall enter or cause to be entered regularly In the Society's books to be kept by such officer for that purpose full and accurate accounts of all money received and paid out on account of the Society; shall perform all acts incident to the position of Treasurer subject to the control of the Council; and shall, if required by the Council, give such bond for the faithful discharge of such officer's duties in such form as the Council may require.

COUNCIL AND COMMITTEES (number): term of service

4. Council Member (2): January 1, 2022 – December 31, 2025

Two Councilors shall be elected every other year by mail or electronic ballot to serve for a period of four years and shall assume office on the first day of January of the following year. Councilors shall (i) attend each meeting of the Council, (ii) advise the President with respect to financial matters, the Society's publications, national and international issues that may affect the future of the Society and other matters relating to the Society, the local chapters and the membership, and (iii) serve as liaisons to other scientific and professional societies. Councilors shall not be eligible for immediate reelection, unless such election is recommended by a vote of three-fourths (3/4) or more of the other members of the Council or a majority vote of the Active Members.

5. Nomination Committee (6): January 1, 2022 – December 31, 2023

A Chair and five (5) members of the Society, who hold no other elective office, shall be elected to be the Nomination Committee by mail or electronic ballot on the second year of the new administration of the SCBA.

The six candidates who receive the highest number of votes shall be declared elected; the one receiving the most votes shall serve as the Chairperson. The Nominating Committee members shall assume their responsibility on January 1 immediately following the year of their election for a two-year term. It shall be the responsibility of the Nominating Committee to identify and nominate potential candidates for elected offices of the Society in the election process, starting at the end of the first year of the new administration, with a schedule to be completed before May 15 of the second year, according to the specifications defined by the SCBA Bylaws.

6. Membership Committee (6). January 1, 2022 – December 31, 2023.

A Chair and five (5) members of the Society, who hold no other elective office, shall be elected to be the Membership Committee by mail or electronic ballot on the second year of the new administration of the SCBA. The six candidates who receive the highest number of votes shall be declared elected; the one receiving the most votes shall serve as the Chairperson. The Membership Committee members shall assume their responsibility on January 1 immediately following the year of their election for a two-year term. The Membership Committee shall organize national and local membership drive activities, review and approve membership applications, review and present the record of Members with problems, as defined by these Bylaws, for possible Council action or expulsion, and work closely with the Executive Director in updating membership profiles and publishing the membership directory. The Membership Committee shall also act as a liaison to the local chapters and international membership nominees to serve as officers and representatives of the Society. The Membership Committee shall also identify and recruit individuals with special scientific and technical expertise by nominating them for membership in the Society.






